

## **Toddler Web Activities for Lessons One-Six for Y4Q1**

**Week One:** God's Righteousness and Man's Sin

### **Reinforcement Activity**

(10 minutes)

*Supplies Needed: Magazines that include nature pictures (optional)*

If the weather permits, take the children on a walk outside. Encourage them to find items that show God's amazing, creative power. If weather does not permit, look through magazines together to find pictures of creation. As they look at the pictures, remind them that God created people and animals too. Remind them that we can see God's holy power through all of the things He has created.

**Week Two: Victory Over Sin**

**Reinforcement Activity**

(10 minutes)

Pair each child up with a partner. One child will be the leader and the other child will practice having faith. Remind the children that having faith means believing or trusting in something. The leader of the pair will help his partner walk across the room by using his words and holding his partner's hands. The child who is following will close his eyes and trust his leader. Be sure to remove any obstacles that may cause injury and remind the leaders that they should carefully lead their partners around objects.

When the students have successfully crossed the room, let them switch roles for the walk back. Remind them that God wants us to have faith in Him. Jesus already did the work—we just need to believe in Him.

**Week Three: The First and Last Adam**

**Reinforcement Activity**

(10 minutes)

*Supplies Needed: Dessert-sized paper plates, glue sticks, scissors, construction paper (including red, green, and brown)*

*Teacher Note:* As you prepare for this lesson, cut small leaves from the green paper and stems from the brown paper. Each child will need one leaf and one stem. The children will make apples out of dessert-sized paper plates, so the leaves and stems should be proportional to the plates.

Give each child a piece of red construction paper. Show the children how to tear the paper into pieces that are about an inch and a half square. Once the children have finished tearing the red paper, give them each a paper plate and a glue stick. Encourage them to cover the plate with the red paper pieces using the glue stick.

As they work, remind the children that Adam chose to disobey God by eating the fruit God had forbidden him to eat, which was a sin. God shows us forgiveness for all of our sins through Jesus. Once the children have finished covering their plates with the red pieces, help them glue a leaf and a stem at the top of the plate to create an apple.

**Week Four:** Victory in Christ

**Reinforcement Activity**

(10 minutes)

*Supplies Needed: Shield resource page, glue sticks, large sequins, feathers, tissue squares, glitter glue, stickers, pieces of patterned paper, scissors*

Give each student a copy of the Shield resource page (see resources). Provide an assortment of items for them to use to decorate their shields such as large sequins, feathers, tissue squares, glitter glue, stickers, scissors, and pieces of patterned paper. Instruct them to create strong, beautiful shields. As the children work, remind them that we have victory in Jesus.

**Week Five: The Gospel for the Nations**

**Reinforcement Activity**

(10 minutes)

*Supplies Needed: Globe or world map*

Gather the children around the globe or map. Allow each child to take a turn randomly placing his finger on the globe or map. See where his finger lands and help him trace his way back home. As you investigate the world together, remind the children that people who have never heard of Jesus live all around the world and even in the places their fingers have landed.

Take time to pray for the unreached people of the world. Remind the children of the importance of telling others about Jesus.

**Week Six:** Division in the Church

**Reinforcement Activity**

(10 minutes)

*Supplies Needed: Masking tape*

*Teacher Note:* As you prepare for this lesson, create a hopscotch course on the floor using masking tape.

Demonstrate how to hop with one foot in the single squares and two feet in the double squares across the hopscotch course you created on the floor. Then allow each child to take a turn hopping across the course. When a child reaches the end, he must tell you an example of showing kindness. Remind the children of how important it is to share God's love and the truth of Jesus with one another instead of fighting.
