

Toddler Web Activities for Lessons Seven-Thirteen for Y1Q3

Week Seven: The Parting of the Red Sea

Reinforcement Activity

(10 minutes)

Supplies Needed: Large bowl, water, plastic table cloth

Teacher Note: Before beginning this activity, fill a bowl halfway with water. Place the bowl on a plastic tablecloth to protect the surface of the table from any water that may splash out of the bowl.

Remind the children of today's Treasure Story and how God allowed the Israelites to cross through the Red Sea on dry ground. Invite each child forward to blow on the water in the bowl and see if they can separate the water into two sides. After every child has had a turn, remind the class that only God could part a big sea. Emphasize that there is no one as powerful or awesome as God.

Week Eight: God's Provision in the Wilderness

Reinforcement Activity

(10 minutes)

Supplies Needed: Sheets or blankets, clothespins, chairs, cotton balls or scraps of paper, cups of water

Invite the children to act out today's Treasure Story. Use sheets or blankets to make a tent in the classroom big enough for all of the children to sit under. They will pretend to be the Israelites camping in the wilderness. Instruct them to sit in the tent and pretend it is night time. As they wait, place cotton balls or scraps of paper on the floor outside the tent to represent manna. Then tell the children that morning has arrived and invite them to collect the manna. Provide water for the children to drink and remind the children that God provided for His people.

Week Nine: The Covenant at Sinai

Reinforcement Activity

(10 minutes)

Supplies Needed: Phone, mailing envelopes, paper and pencils, a microphone, computer

Teacher Note: Before beginning this activity, you will need to gather the following items or pictures of the items: a phone, mailing envelopes, paper and pencils, a microphone, and a computer.

In this activity, the students will learn about different ways to communicate with others. This will help them understand that God's way of communicating with Moses was very special. Show the children each of the items you brought. Ask them to name each one. Explain how each item helps us communicate with others.

In today's Treasure Story, God didn't call Moses on the phone or write him a letter. God talked to Moses through the cloud on Mount Sinai. Discuss the awesome power of God and the gift His written words are to us.

Week Ten: The Tabernacle

Reinforcement Activity

(10 minutes)

Supplies Needed: Blocks

Invite the children to make a church from blocks. Encourage them work together and help each other. Remind them that we can learn about God at church, but because of Jesus, we can talk to God anytime and anywhere. When we believe in Jesus, God the Holy Spirit lives in us and helps us. God is always with His people.

Week Eleven: The Golden Calf

Reinforcement Activity

(10 minutes)

Supplies Needed: God Is Number One resource page, crayons, scissors, tape, construction paper

Teacher Note: Before beginning this activity, you will need to cut out the hand from the God Is Number One resource page (see resources). Each child will need one hand.

Give each child one of the hands you cut out of the resource page earlier. Read the words to the children and invite them to color the hand. Once they are finished decorating them, tape a small piece of construction paper to the back of the hands so that the children can place their own hands in the pocket created between the resource page and the construction paper. The children can wear their handprints while they say, "God is number one!"

Remind the class that God wants to be first in our lives. He wants and deserves to be number one.

Week Twelve: God Forgives Israel

Reinforcement Activity

(10 minutes)

Supplies Needed: Red cardstock, hole punch, yarn, markers, scissors, wide tube-shaped pasta

Teacher Note: Before beginning this activity, you will need to cut large heart shapes from red cardstock. Each child will need one heart. Write “God is my friend” on the hearts. Use a hole punch to make two holes in the heart—one on each bump at the top of the heart. Tie a long section of yarn through one of the holes.

Give each child a heart and several pieces of pasta. Explain that they will be making necklaces to remind them that God wants to be our friend. Show them how to feed the yarn through the pasta to create beads on their necklaces. As they are working, remind them that when we believe in Jesus and ask Him to forgive our sin, we get to be God’s friends. When they are finished, help them secure the yarn by tying it to the second hole. Allow the children to wear their necklaces.

Week Thirteen: Salvation in Exodus

Reinforcement Activity

(10 minutes)

Supplies Needed: Cardstock, scissors, tape, markers, jewel stickers

Teacher Note: Before beginning this activity, you will need to cut crowns out of cardstock. Write “Jesus Is King” on the crowns. Each child will need one crown.

Give a cardstock crown to each child. Invite the children to color and add jewel sticker to their crowns. Use tape to secure the crowns in circles for the children to wear. If any crowns are not long enough to fit around a child’s head, you can extend the crowns by adding a strip of cardstock to them. Help the children put the crowns on their heads. As they work, explain that the Bible tells us Jesus is the King over all other kings. Emphasize that Jesus is greater than anyone else, even Moses or Pharaoh.
