

## ROOM SET-UP

Hang technical drawings or blueprints on the wall to suggest construction. To illustrate various types of foundations in which students put their trust, construct wooden benches for students to sit on. Build some sturdy benches to represent the foundation we have in Christ, and build some rickety benches so students will question their stability. For an easier approach, provide stools and chairs of various structural soundness.
